6:00 PM: Regional Scan Review (25 mins)

- Jaime Garibay, our FACE Specialist, shared a portion of the Regional Scan with Family Council Members to give their input.
- Family Council Members have an opportunity to have an open discussion, and responses are below:
 - Regarding the census: why are there only white, Hispanic/Latino,
 Black/African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Native
 Hawaiian, and other Pacific islanders, and other (what is other?)
 - o It appears like there are a lot of opportunities for child care-looks like we have many children and many services, looking from the data aspect.
 - o On paper, things look good regarding the data on the Regional Scan.
- What is missing from the Regional Scan?
- Family Council Members have an open discussion after reviewing the Regional Scan and discuss what is missing from the Regional Scan. See responses below:
 - Disagrees with all the stipulations referring to "Everything is about a number."
 - o Over the pandemic, everything has gone up except for paychecks.
 - o You are waiting for months to receive approvals from CCAP.
 - Experience with childcare has never been a peaceful transition; it's almost set up for you to fail.
 - o Data isn't current with what is happening in Region 1-B-C.
 - O As a licensed home child care provider, families can sign up for a relative to get money from the state to receive child care. How many families are enrolled in this? What kind of programs are they on? Are they receiving quality care?
 - o License Exempt vs. Exempt: They choose to stay exempt vs. going to licensed (Jaime will check on more data).
 - o I am surprised at the number of children unaccounted for. I think it may be because some of these children are homeschooled. I feel that should be captured in the data. Homeschooled or kept at home.
 - O Also, I think there should be more options for median-income families not qualifying for Head Start or other programs.



O Still, they can't necessarily afford private child care and don't meet income requirements for affordable programs.

Decisions made: The Region 1-B-C Team will review the Family Council Members' responses and update the Regional Scan Document.

6:25 PM: Early Childhood Education and Care Workforce (25 mins)

 What is the region's early childhood education and care workforce landscape? Let's start with our children's classrooms: Do they resemble your community?

Notes:

- Family Council Members have an open discussion after reviewing the Early Childhood Education and Care Workforce in Region 1-B-C. See responses below:
 - o Illinois School-Park Forest is Overcrowded but diverse.
 - Steger-Out of 30 teachers, there are maybe two African American teachers and zero Hispanic Teachers. They did have an African American principal, but she was replaced with a Hispanic principal.
 - At public schools, our children are disadvantaged compared to private schools.
 - o Park Forest-Black Hawk, most of the staff is African American, with a few white teachers and no Hispanic teachers.
 - Missing parent liaisons, therapists, custodians, cooks, school bus drivers, and nurses.
- How diverse are the ECEC Workforce and the Workforce representative of their communities?
 - o Family Council Members decided that the ECEC Workforce isn't very diverse in Region 1-B-C.
