Notes: briefly went over Smart Start Illinois – noted that without staff these plans will never come to fruition

# 1:40pm: Early Childhood Education and Care Workforce Staff

Notes:

- Reviewed demographics of teachers and staff staff mostly non-bilingual female staff
  - o Representative of Region
- Reviewed Education of Licensed Center Teachers
  - Mostly High School GED
  - Smaller number with high education levels
  - o Requirements don't need any sort of college degree
    - Higher Education Navigators through CCR&R to help GED staff to go back to school to get ECEC education
    - ECA Scholarship making a huge difference in ECEC enrollment in college
    - Partnership with Ren Lake College training with college credit attached (6 credit hours)
- Recruitment by providers
  - o Colleges working on programs



- Effingham Co. in the process of stabilization grants (similar to Great Start) – a stipend given to ECEC workers in Effingham Co. based on longevity and part-time/full-time status
  - One-time payment annually, or semi-annually
  - Funds to come from donations from local businesses
- o No initiatives in Regions doing work toward recruitment
- Infant Toddler Credentials
  - Mostly no harder to get
    - The yes most likely Accelerate program and credentials are pushed
  - Specific requirements in addition to the ECE credential (cannot get without the ECE credential)
  - Difficult to navigate the credential chart
  - Numbers of staff with credentials are climbing since the current data came out
  - o Directors supporting staff to get credentials
    - Incentive to meet Accelerate standards Associate degrees come out with ECE 4 and Infant/Toddler 4
    - Higher wages for staff with these credentials
- ECE Credentials
  - o More staff that have the credential than Infant/Toddler credential
  - o No fee, no transcripts needed (level 1)
    - Level 1 does not count towards Accelerate
    - Best practice for child care centers to require ECE Level 1 in the first 90 days
  - o What level does this data show?
    - ECE Credentials 2-6 require college course work and experience
  - o Anyone registered with Gateways is included in the data
    - Can skew data if people who have credentials do not work in a child care center anymore
  - Data does not show ECE 5 credentials
- Final Slot Gap Numbers
  - Data starts in 2020 at the beginning of Covid when a lot of centers were closed or severely limited
  - o Jamboard What does the information regarding the placement of early childhood education and care sites, along with the slot gap, contribute to the conversation about the early childhood workforce?



- Smaller towns have fewer resources the more rural you get the harder it is
- If more slots were available in these deserts, then families possibly would work in their own community
- Not a lot of work available in smaller communities so parents commute to work and therefore find child care where the jobs are
- Children are most at risk when parents are desperate to find care to be able to work
