# During the meeting:

- Recap of the previous months.

  - Shared community agreements with Family Council and asked if there was more to add.
  - The Council introduced themselves and their family information to the guest speakers.
- Guest Speaker/Panel:
  - Three guest speakers were invited and presented at the Family Council Meeting:
    - Ellise Boyd-Johnson, Executive Director of Anointed Childcare Academy,
       Infant Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant.
    - Mary Valerius, Social and Emotional Consultant, Child and Family Connections #15.
    - Christine Sparks, Manager of JumpStart, Home Visiting Program.
- Child and Family Connections:
  - Region 56 shared with the council members a few questions surrounding Child and Family Connections (CFC):



- What is CFC?
  - Mary Valerius, Social and Emotional Consultant, Child and Family Connections #15 shared in the meeting:
    - Offers resources, information, and supports for families.
    - Educates and trains people with disabilities, families, and professionals, among other supports.
- What services exist in our Region?
  - Shared information on services that are provided in our Region.
  - Mentioned that there are limited numbers of providers in different disciplines that are available to support families.
  - Explained that there are not enough services/supports to help with family needs.
- What have been your experiences with CFC?
  - Learned about the EI-specific supports.
  - The Family Council Members shared some lived experiences surrounding Child and Family Connections, services, and relevant supports.
- How could Home Visiting and CFC services be improved to better support the mental and/or behavioral health needs of children, families, and caregivers?
  - CFC provided information to council members as an Early Intervention family guide, as well as a How I/ECMHC works in Early Intervention.
  - Service coordinators meet with families to give information on the program, however, there is only a certain amount of time to provide information to the families. There is a lot of crucial information that is missed.
  - Possible idea to have all entities to come together as a group, building out as opposed to duplicating.

### • Home Visiting:

- JumpStart:
  - Christine Sparks, Manager of JumpStart, Home Visiting Program.
    - Start before birth.
    - Families in Illinois can enroll when prenatal.
    - Funded through the Illinois State Board of Education.
    - There are different types of funded Home Visiting Programs in the state.
    - Barriers connecting to others who may need the program.
    - Work on the attachment piece for the parent and the child.
    - Mental Health in Home Visiting:



- Postpartum depression.
- Life challenges that make spending time with their children challenging.
- Mental Health Consultants provide in-home support to the parent/child.
- Most families are referred by agencies or other parents who have received the services.
- Region 56 asked the council what Home Visiting is.
  - Family Council members shared lived experiences with Home Visiting, positive and negative experiences.
  - Council Member questions:
    - Why are there no parent councils?
      - There are parent advisory groups.
      - Mentioned that it seems Birth to Five Illinois: Region 56 (Will County) is one of the first to do the Action/Family Councils.
      - Building on the capacity that parents/families will want to be a part of advisories and councils' long term in the future.
    - Is this program for only first-time parents?
      - The program is open to every family dynamic, no matter first-time parents, caregivers, multiple children, age, etc.
      - Enrollment visits include eligibility based on family challenges that take priority.
    - Is there a way this information can be shared with pediatricians across Illinois to gauge parents' and families' interests?
      - The pediatricians have their mandates and limited time.
- Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant (I/ECMHC):
- Ellise Boyd-Johnson Executive Director of Anointed Childcare Academy, Infant Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant.
  - Misconception is the children are receiving mental health, it is for the adults that work with the children, to help with prevention, and provide success.
  - Improve emotional functioning and find out what is hindering growth.
  - Mental Health Consultations meet with teachers and parents and find out what the barriers are.
  - Identify barriers before age three years old.
  - Questions:
    - How do I find these services?
      - Go onto Illinois Gateways, Parent Connections, find a consultant, and find one that fits.

  - Region 56 asked a few questions about the presenters in chat and to be sent as follow-up questions:

    - Who is not being served by these programs, and why?
